

Plenty of	enough of something ex: I have plenty of time.
• too much	 more than enough of something (uncountable) ex: I don't want too much sugar in my tea.
• too many	more than enough of something (countable in plural form) ex: There are too many people in the train.
• all of / all	100 % of something ex: All of my paper are gone.
a little	 small amount of something (uncountable) ex: Can I have a little sugar, please?
• a few	 small amount of something (countable in plural forms) ex: The market is just a few meters away.
none of	nothing at all ex: None of the class pass the exam.
any some	 questions and negative sentences ex: She doesn't have any questions. positive sentences ex: I have some questions to ask you.
