BOOKWORM

Do you read books a lot? What kind of books do you read? What other kinds of book do you know of?

DEFINITION

A **bookworm** is someone who enjoys and spends a lot of time reading books. The term, which generally refers to a type of worm that feeds on paper, has been used metaphorically to refer to someone who always has their nose in a book.

LANGUAGE POINT

The **Present Simple** tense of the verb is often used when retelling the story of a book or film.

Examples:

Harry sets off with Ron and Hermione on a difficult quest to defeat Voldemort. (Harry Potter) Nick learns that Jay Gatsby knew Daisy is deeply in love with her. (The Great Gatsby)
