Annie: How many kilos of beef did you buy?

Sam: I bought 3 kilos. How about you?

Annie: I bought 2 kilos.

Sam: 3 plus 2 is 5. We bought 5 kilos of beef.

Annie: Yes. And I'm feeling thirsty now.

I want to buy 1 bottle of milk.

Sam: I'm thirsty, too. I want 2 bottles of milk.

Annie: 1 plus 2 is 3. We should buy 3 bottles.

Sam: That's correct. How much are they, Annie?

Annie: Each bottle of milk is \$2. They are \$6.

$$3 \times 2 = 6$$



$$3 + 2 = 5$$

Read and learn

Annie: How many kilos of beef did you buy?

Sam: I bought 3 kilos. How about you?

Annie: I bought 2 kilos.

Sam: 3 plus 2 is 5. We bought 5 kilos of beef.

Annie: Yes. And I'm feeling thirsty now.

I want to buy 1 bottle of milk.

Sam: I'm thirsty, too. I want 2 bottles of milk.

Annie: 1 plus 2 is 3. We should buy 3 bottles.

Sam: That's correct. How much are they, Annie?

Annie: Each bottle of milk is \$2. They are \$6. (\$: dollar)

$$3 \times 2 = 6$$



$$3 + 2 = 5$$

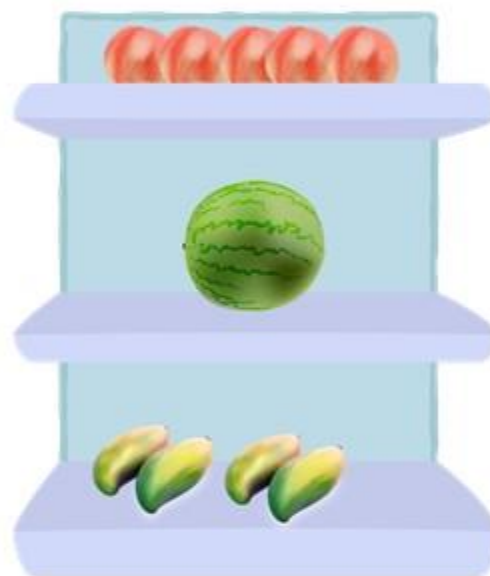
