- There are 6 different kinds of flamingos in the world.
- An adult flamingo's legs are longer than its body.
- The food they eat makes their feathers go pink.
- Baby flamingos are grey or white.

- Wild flamingos can live for 20 to 30 years.
- Female flamingos lay only one egg each year.
- Flamingos feed their babies with "crop milk".
- Flamingos often stand on one foot to preserve body heat.
- A flamingo flock can have more than a million birds.
