B: It is, but if I make them change, that is something I am most proud of.

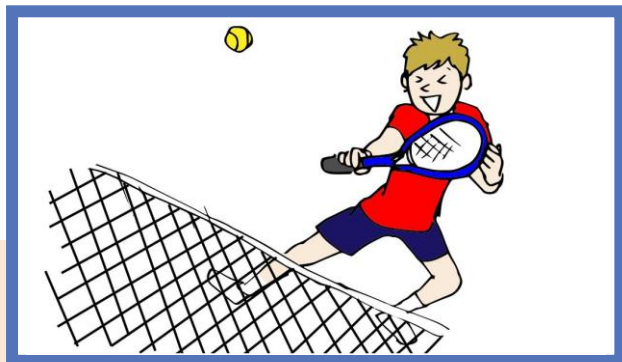

B: Tennis is a lot of fun, plus it makes you fitter.

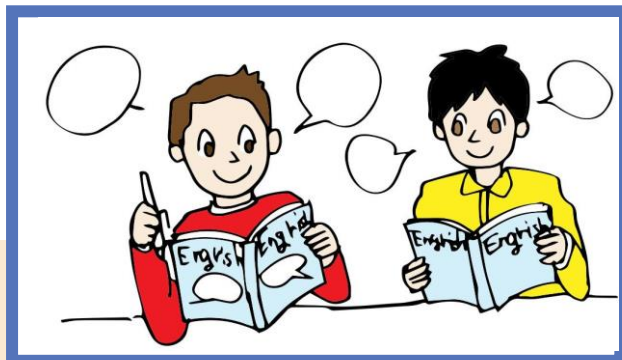

I am good at reading and writing in English.

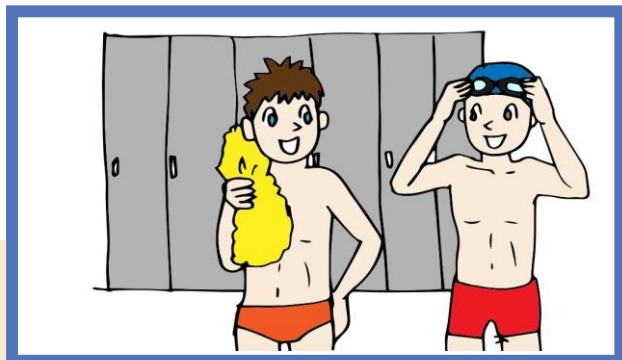
