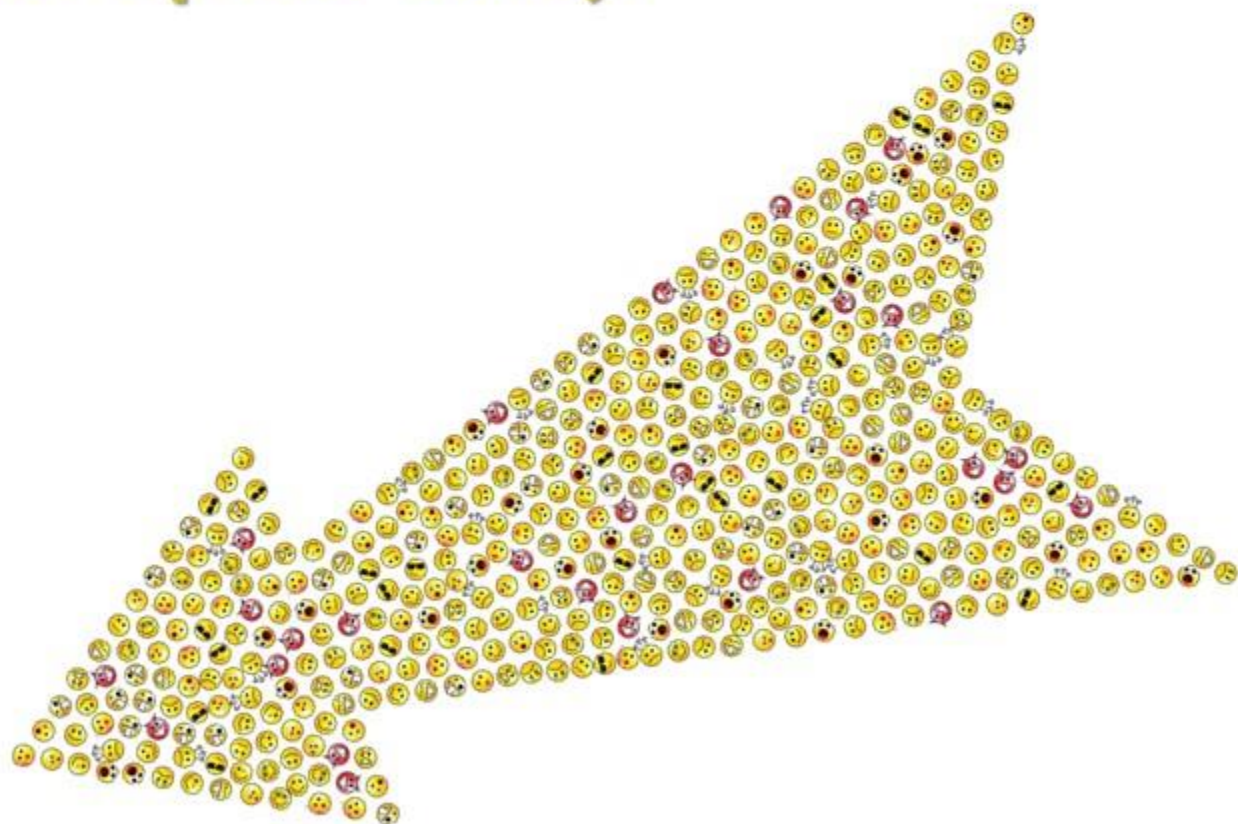

The Most Popular Emoji

There are more than 3,000 emojis around, but only some are popular. Here are some of them. Find your favorite and learn to describe it.



Read and learn.

A face with round open eyes and an open mouth. We use this emoji when we are deeply **impressed** by **something good or bad**.



A face with tightly-closed eyes, an open mouth and a tongue **sticking out**. It looks silly but friendly.



impress = to admire someone or something

stick out
= to put something outside

Read and learn.



A face with wide **blank** eyes and an open screaming mouth. It is used to express great fear or surprise.



A face with wide open eyes and **pupils**, red cheeks and a small closed mouth. This emoji is used to express **embarrassment**.

blank

= empty or clear

pupil

= the black round part in the middle of the eye

embarrassment

= a feeling of being nervous or ashamed because of something

A face with closed eyes and a mask over the mouth.
This emoji means “sick”.



A face with closed eyes, a relaxed slightly open mouth and a **snot bubble**. It means sleepy. You can use it if you sleep during class.



snot bubble

= a ball of air made by the wet thing from the nose
